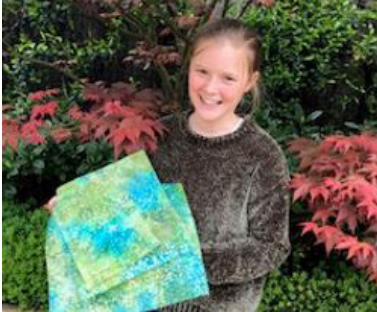


Examples of Action
