

# Bilby Activity Instructions

A number of different activity stations have been set up in the classroom to help you learn about bilbies. The greater bilby is one of Australia's endangered species.



You can choose from the following activities:

- Playing computer games about bilbies.
- Exploring information about bilbies on the computers.
- Viewing photos of bilbies on the computers.
- Creating drawings to show information about bilbies (appearance, features, habitat, food, predators etc).
- Creating a model of a bilby which shows information about it (appearance, features, habitat, food, predators etc).

## Rules for activities:

- Ensure that you share resources fairly with others, particularly when using craft materials such as pencils and/or modelling dough.
- A timer will be set to go off every 10 minutes. When this goes off anyone on a computer must change to another activity, this can be a different computer activity.
- You may choose to work with a partner at a computer, but there is to be no more than 2 people at one computer.
- The drawing station can have a maximum of \_\_\_ people.
